--<u>John 18:28-32</u>: Then they led Jesus from Caiaphas into the Praetorium, and it was early; and they themselves did not enter into the Praetorium so that they would not be defiled, but might eat the Passover. Therefore Pilate went out to them and said, "What accusation do you bring against this Man?" They answered and said to him, "If this Man were not an evildoer, we would not have delivered Him to you." So Pilate said to them, "Take Him yourselves, and judge Him according to your law." The Jews said to him, "<u>We are not permitted to put anyone to death</u>," to fulfill the word of Jesus which He spoke, signifying by <u>what kind of death</u> He was about to die.

--<u>Psalm 22:15-16</u>: My strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue cleaves to my jaws; and You lay me in the dust of death. For dogs have surrounded me; a band of evildoers has encompassed me; *they pierced my hands and my feet*.

--<u>Numbers 21:4-9</u>: Then they set out from Mount Hor by the way of the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; and the people became impatient because of the journey. And the Lord sent fiery serpents among the people and they bit the people, so that many people of Israel died. --The Claims Of Jesus:

--<u>Claim #1</u>: I am…The <u>I AM</u>!!!

--John 8:23-24, 51-53, 57-59

--<u>Claim #2</u>: I AM the MESSIAH

--<u>John 18:33, 36-37</u>: Therefore Pilate entered again into the Praetorium, and summoned Jesus and said to Him, "Are You the King of the Jews?"...Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, then My servants would be fighting so that I would not be handed over to the Jews; but as it is, My kingdom is not of this realm." Therefore Pilate said to Him, "So You are a king?" Jesus answered, "<u>You say correctly that I am a king</u>. <u>For this I have been born</u>, and <u>for this I have come into the world</u>, to testify to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears My voice."

--<u>Luke 1:1-4</u>: Inasmuch as many have undertaken to compile an account of the things accomplished among us, just as they were handed down to us by those who from the beginning were <u>eyewitnesses</u> and servants of the word, it seemed fitting for me as well, <u>having investigated everything carefully from the beginning</u>, to write it out for you <u>in</u> <u>consecutive order</u>, most excellent Theophilus; so that you may know <u>the exact truth</u> about the things you have been taught.

--Key Concept #1: FULFILLED prophecy is the MANDATE for any would-be Messiah!!!

--<u>Key Concept #2</u>: <u>FULFILLED</u> prophecy is the hallmark of sovereignty...because it proves that He is not constrained by <u>TIME</u>!!!

--<u>Key Concept #3</u>: Any and all apparent <u>INCONSISTENCIES</u> between Jesus' life and the Messianic prophecies <u>must</u> be <u>RESOLVED</u>...or the entire foundation of Christianity <u>CRUMBLES</u>!!!

--<u>Luke 24:44</u>: He said to them, "These are My words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that <u>all</u> things which are <u>written</u> about Me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms <u>must</u> be fulfilled."

--<u>CS Lewis</u>: I am trying to prevent anyone from saying the really foolish thing that people often say about Jesus: "I'm ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don't accept His claim to be God." That is the one thing we must not say. A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic—on a level with the man who says he is a poached egg—or else he would be the Devil of Hell. You can shut Him up for a fool, you can spit at Him and kill Him as a demon; or you can fall at His feet and call Him Lord and God. But let us not bring any patronizing nonsense about His being a great human teacher. He has not left that open to us. He did not intend to. --<u>What logic demands from the Messianic claims of Jesus</u>: He raised the bar so high that He is either a <u>LIAR</u>...a <u>LUNATIC</u> or...He is <u>LORD</u>!!!

--The Fulfillment of Prophecy By Jesus of Nazareth:

--<u>Prophecy #1</u>: The Passover Lamb was taken out of the flock on Nisan <u>10</u> to be <u>OBSERVED</u> --<u>Exod 12:1-3</u>: Now the Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, "This month shall be the beginning of months for you; it is to be the <u>first month</u> of the year to you. Speak to all the congregation of Israel, saying, 'On the <u>tenth of this month</u> they are each one to take a lamb for themselves, according to their fathers' households, a lamb for each household.

--Prophecy #2: The Lamb was SLAIN by Israel on Nisan 14

--<u>Exod 12:5-6</u>: Your lamb shall be an <u>unblemished</u> male a year old; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats. You shall keep it until the <u>fourteenth day of the same</u> <u>month</u>, then the whole assembly of the congregation of <u>Israel is to kill it</u> at twilight.

--<u>Prophecy #3</u>: **PREDICTION** of the **EXACT** date of the Triumphal Entry

--<u>Dan 9:24-25</u>: <u>Seventy weeks</u> have been decreed for your people and your holy city, to finish the transgression, to make an end of sin, to make atonement for iniquity, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal up vision and prophecy and to anoint the most holy place. So you are to know and discern that <u>from the issuing of a decree</u> to restore and rebuild Jerusalem <u>until</u> Messiah the Prince there will be <u>seven</u> weeks and <u>sixty-two</u> weeks...

--<u>From</u>: The issuing of the decree to rebuild Jerusalem: Nisan 1, <u>445</u> BC

--<u>Until</u>: The Triumphal Entry: Nisan 10, <u>32</u> AD

--<u>Prophecy #4</u>: Messiah had to <u>DIE</u>...and it had to happen <u>BEFORE</u> the destruction of the Temple in AD <u>70</u>

--<u>Dan 9:26</u>: Then after the sixty-two weeks the <u>Messiah will be cut off</u> and have nothing, and the people of the prince who is to come <u>will destroy the city and the sanctuary</u>.

--<u>Prophecy #5</u>: <u>Gen 49:1-2</u>: Then Jacob summoned his sons and said, "Assemble yourselves that I may tell you *what will befall you in the days to come*. "Gather together and hear, O sons of Jacob; and listen to Israel your father.

--<u>Gen 49:10</u>: "The <u>scepter</u> shall not depart from <u>Judah</u>, nor the <u>ruler's staff</u> from between his feet, <u>until Shiloh comes</u>..."

--<u>What does Prophecy #5 mean</u>? The <u>PRINCE</u> of Peace had to be born <u>BEFORE</u> the <u>scepter</u> was taken away from Israel

--<u>The historical meaning of this prophecy</u>: The Messiah had to be <u>born</u>...<u>BEFORE</u> AD <u>7</u>

--<u>Prophecy #6</u>: Messiah had to be <u>born</u> in **BETHLEHEM**

--<u>Micah 5:4-5</u>: And <u>*He*</u> will arise and shepherd <u>*His*</u> flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord His God. And they will remain, because at that time <u>*He*</u> will be great to the ends of the earth. 5 This <u>*One*</u> will be our <u>*peace*</u>.

--<u>V. 2</u>: "But as for you, <u>Bethlehem</u> Ephrathah, too little to be among the clans of <u>Judah</u>, from you <u>One</u> will go forth for Me to be <u>ruler</u> in Israel. <u>His</u> goings forth are from long ago, from the days of <u>eternity</u>."

--<u>Luke 2:1-6</u>: Now in those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus, that a census be taken of all the inhabited earth. This was the first census taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. And everyone was on his way to register for the census, each to his own city. Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David which is called <u>Bethlehem</u>, because he was of the house and family of David, in order to register along with Mary, who was engaged to him, and was with child. While they were there, the days were completed for her to give birth. And she gave birth to her firstborn son...

--<u>Prophecy #7</u>: LOTS would be cast for His GARMENTS

--<u>Psa 22:18</u>: They divide my *garments* among them, and for my clothing they *cast lots*.

--<u>Luke 23:33-34</u>: When they came to the place called The Skull, there they crucified Him and the criminals, one on the right and the other on the left. But Jesus was saying, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And <u>they cast lots,</u> <u>dividing up His garments</u> among themselves.

--<u>Prophecy #8</u>: <u>Exactly 30</u> shekels of <u>SILVER</u> would be paid for the betrayer's wages...and the silver would go to the <u>POTTER</u> to buy a field

--<u>Zech 11:10-13</u>: "I took <u>my staff, Favor</u>, and cut it in pieces, to break my covenant which I had made with all the peoples. So <u>it was broken</u> on that day, and thus the afflicted of the flock who were watching me realized that it was the word of the Lord." And I said to them, "If it is good in your sight, give me my wages; but if not, never mind!" So they weighed out <u>thirty shekels of silver</u> as my wages. Then the Lord said to me, "<u>Throw it to the potter</u>, that magnificent price at <u>which I was valued by them</u>." So <u>I took</u> <u>the thirty shekels of silver and threw them to the potter</u> in the house of the Lord.

--<u>Matt 26:14-15</u>: Then one of the twelve, named Judas Iscariot, went to the chief priests and said, "What are you willing to give me to betray Him to you?" And <u>they weighed out</u> <u>thirty pieces of silver</u> to him.

---<u>Matt 27:3-8, 10</u>: Then when Judas, who had betrayed Him, saw that He had been condemned, he felt remorse and returned the <u>thirty pieces of silver</u> to the chief priests and elders, saying, "I have sinned by betraying innocent blood." But they said, "What is that to us? See to that yourself!" And he threw the pieces of silver <u>into the temple sanctuary</u> and departed; and he went away and hanged himself. The chief priests took the pieces of silver and said, "It is not lawful to put them into the temple treasury, since it is the price of blood." And they conferred together and with the money bought the Potter's Field as a burial place for strangers...Then that which was spoken through Jeremiah the prophet was fulfilled: "And they took the <u>thirty pieces of silver</u>, the price of the one whose price had been set by the sons of Israel; and they gave them for the <u>Potter's Field</u>..."

--<u>A fragile prophecy</u>: All the chief priests would've had to do to **DISQUALIFY** Jesus as the Messiah would be to give Judas <u>31</u> pieces of silver!!!

--<u>Prophecy #9</u>: The **BONES** of the Lamb could not be **BROKEN**

--<u>Exodus 12:43, 46</u>: The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, "This is the ordinance of the Passover...It is to be eaten in a single house; you are not to bring forth any of the flesh outside of the house, <u>nor are you to break any bone of it</u>.

--<u>John 19:31-22, 35-36</u>: Then the Jews, because it was the day of preparation, so that the bodies would not remain on the cross on the Sabbath (for that Sabbath was a high day), asked Pilate <u>that their legs might be broken</u>, and that they might be taken away. So the soldiers came, and <u>broke the legs of the first man and of the other</u> who was crucified with Him; but coming to Jesus, when they saw that He was already dead, <u>they did not break His legs</u>...And he who has seen has testified, and his testimony is true; and he knows that he is telling the truth, so that you also may believe. <u>For these things came to pass to fulfill the Scripture, "Not a bone of Him shall be broken</u>."

--<u>Prophecy #10</u>: <u>MESSIAH</u> would be <u>CRUCIFIED</u>

--<u>Psalm 22:16</u>: For dogs have surrounded me; a band of evildoers has encompassed me; <u>they pierced my hands and my feet</u>.

--Crucifixion Prophesies:

--Moses: (Numb 21, Deut 21): <u>1450</u> BC --David: (Psa 22): <u>1000</u> BC --Zechariah: (Zech 12): 600 BC

--<u>Historical fact</u>: Crucifixion was first used for execution: ~<u>150</u> BC

--<u>An attack on Scripture</u>: The only way to deny the miraculous implications of these types of prophecies is to maintain that the text was <u>**RE</u>**-written and <u>**MANIPULATED**</u> to fit the life of Jesus <u>**AFTER**</u> he lived.</u>

--Be Armed to defend The Faith:

--The Argument against historical prophecy:

- 1. The <u>DETAILS</u> of the life of Jesus are so well <u>DOCUMENTED</u> that there's no way to meaningfully <u>DENY</u> the facts
- 2. The <u>MATCH</u> between what is contained in the OT Prophets and the life of Jesus is truly <u>ASTONISHING</u>
- 3. If the Prophets were written **<u>BEFORE</u>** Jesus lived...they prove that God knows and controls the <u>FUTURE</u>...and that Jesus is the True <u>**MESSIAH**</u>
- 4. The only way to **DISCREDIT** the Prophets...and Jesus' claims...is to maintain that the OT "prophecies" were written **AFTER** the events happened

Timeline of the Ancient Biblical Manuscripts

--<u>The take-home message from the Dead Sea Scrolls</u>: Any event that occurs after <u>300</u> BC that matches what is found in the Hebrew Scriptures is <u>TRUE</u> prophecy...and its authenticity cannot be logically <u>CHALLENGED</u>

--<u>Application</u>: Biblical faith is based upon <u>VERIFIABLE</u> truth...and is the <u>RATIONAL</u> response of people who are truly <u>OPEN</u>-minded

--Here's the enormous irony of modern skepticism

--<u>The classical skeptics' theme</u>: "Unless you can show me <u>CONVINCING</u> evidence supporting your <u>CASE</u> for faith...I won't <u>BELIEVE</u> what you claim."

--<u>The modern skeptic's theme</u>: "I already <u>KNOW</u> that what you believe about God <u>CAN'T</u> be true...no matter what the <u>EVIDENCE</u> shows."

--<u>The summary of tonight's lesson</u>: Given the truth about the scriptural fulfillment of prophecy by Jesus...the only **<u>REASONABLE</u>** conclusion...based upon the <u>**EVIDENCE**</u>...is that He's <u>**EXACTLY**</u> Who He says He is.

--<u>The likelihood of a given Hebrew male fulfilling just **10** of the Messianic prophecies: --One in 9.3 x 10 to the <u>18th</u> power = <u>9,300,000,000,000,000</u></u>

--<u>The likelihood</u> that Jesus could have fulfilled just <u>**TEN**</u> of the prophecies...is as likely as winning a state lottery <u>**THREE**</u> times in a row...*without* <u>**LOSING**</u> *in between*!!!
