Faith as small as a Mustard Seed

and Outreach Initiatives in 2024

In Matthew 17:20 Jesus said, "if you have faith like a grain of mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there', and it will move, and nothing will be impossible for you."

It does not take big faith to move a big mountain, only a very small bit of faith in the Almighty All-powerful Creator of heaven and earth. How would our lives be different if we regularly applied our small faith to ask God to move big mountains? How would our church be different?

Hebrews 11:1 defines faith as "the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." What do we hope for? Is it in things seen, of this present life, or is it in things unseen, having eternal value? What do we hope for as a church? 2 Corinthians 5:7 says, "we walk by faith, not by sight." How are we to walk by faith?

Outreach initiatives for 2024 include:

- a morning Vacation Bible Camp later in July with Child Evangelism Fellowship

- teen ministry beginning in the Fall with U-Turn Ministries

These are doors of partnership the Lord has opened to us and by faith we walk through. We are partnering with God-centered ministries who have a solid history of gospel sharing and fruit bearing. We might not be able to see what the impact of these partnerships may have for our future. With our grain-of-mustard-seed size faith we take the next step and pray God will accomplish what He has purposed. In Isaiah 55:11 God says of His Word; "it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it." We believe God will accomplish His purposes through these partnerships and in the lives of the kids and youth who will hear the gospel. We come before Him humbly knowing God's work does not depend upon any one of us but rather on our collective surrender and obedience to Him.

Let us as a church come before the Lord God our Maker, praying with our small faith, and expecting that God will move whatever mountains need to be moved. "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and it will be opened to you." (Matthew 7:7).

Let us "worship the Lord in the splendor of holiness" (1 Chronicles 16:29, Psalm 29:2, Psalm 96:9). David celebrated with these words when the ark of the Lord was finally brought into Jerusalem. Like David let us "Ascribe to the Lord the glory due His Name" (1 Chronicles 16:29, Psalm 29:2). "Ah Lord God! Behold, You have made the heavens and the earth by Your great power and by Your outstretched arm! Nothing is too difficult for You." (Jeremiah 32:17).

Let Ephesians 3:20-21 be the attitude of our hearts: "Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us, to Him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen."

Our congregation has long supported the Pregnancy Options and Support Centre. Below on this page, you can see some of the statistics of where that support is going.


They have served 119 individual and their families in 2023. And the ages shown on the left circle were a bit of a surprise.

The Great Evangelists . . .



THE CROSSLEY AND HUNTER MEETINGS

Rev. Ernest Crossley and Rev. J. E. Hunter arrived in Petrolia according to arrangements and commenced evangelistic meetings on the first Sunday of September, 1893. The new skating rink on Tank Street became the grand auditorium; but was not large enough for the great congregations that gathered night after night for three weeks.

The first Sunday was a great day. Services were held morning, afternoon and evening. On each Sunday morning the evangelists separated and occupied the pulpit of the Baptist Church and the Methodist Church. At 4 o'clock separate services es were held for men and women, with a grand mass meeting in the rink in the evening. The old gospel songs were sung with great enthusiasm. The audience was strangely moved from the beginning of the meetings.

Quoting from the Petrolia Advertiser of that date, the Editor said:—"These are not the jumping-jack type of evangelists. They are quiet, sensible and rational. Everyone who

can should attend these meetings."

The late Ed. Fletcher in his 85th year, looking back through sixty-seven years, said "I well remember those meetings. I was a hotel keeper at that time and I lost many of my customers. Many men who often frequented the bar, never returned to drink, Laboring men went to work singing those

gospel songs and the spirit of the refinery and other industries changed. The campaign brought the greatest blessing that ever came to Petrolia." Over eight hundred men and women and teen-agers surrendered to Christ.

The closing services were heart-warming. The audience was loath to see the evangelists leave. Farewell addresses were spoken by Rev. Kelly of the Baptist Church, and Rev. S. Bond of the Methodist Church, and by some of the supervising committee.

In the year of the dedication of the new church, in October, 1900, the evangelists, Rev. E. Crossley and Rev. J. E. Hunter, returned to Petrolia. The memory of the campaign in the skating rink in 1893, was still fresh in the minds of the people. The congregation and the people of Petrolia and surrounding district, gave them a rousing welcome. The services opened with a full capacity audience. The Advertiser estimated that a congregation of 1600 people gathered. For three weeks the services were carried on in the new church. Only eternity can measure the good that was accomplished. To quote one man, Tom Metcalfe, a driller in his 84th year, looked back upon those meetings with a glow of joy. He said, "I attended every one of those meetings. I gave my heart to Christ at that time and he has kept me through all these sixty years."

The Evangelists donated a Pulpit Bible to the new church. For fifty years that Bible served its purpose. It is now kept in memory of the occasion by the congregation.
