Applications made after the closing date may reduce your chances of getting a place at your preferred school, particularly if it is popular. Only apply for schools you are happy for your child to attend to avoid being without a school place in September 2024. Not all children get first choice so a suitable second or third choice should be made.

EYFS

This Week...

F1 have continued to retell the Bear Hunt story and have used their senses to experience the different settings in the story. We also bought our own bears to school to have a teddy bears picnic. We made teddy bear themed snacks and danced with our teddies!

In F2, we have continued to learn to retell our Bus Ride story. Ask your child to tell it to you at home! We have also looked at the difference between a city and a rural environment.

KS1

This Week... in KS1 both Year 1 and Year 2 started to explore a new book called 'Rocket says Look Up' which looks exciting and we can't wait to find out more about what Rocket gets up to. Year 1 have started by writing simple sentences about parts of the story making sure to start with capital letters, use finger spaces in between words and finish with a full stop. Year 2 started the week by hunting for pieces of the front cover, creating questions from the little bits they found and then predicting what they think might happen. In Maths Year 1 have been consolidating all they have learnt about place value and will be moving onto their next unit addition and subtraction next week. Year 2 have been counting in 2s, 5s and 10s-spotting patterns and finding missing numbers. In RE we have been looking at the Christian story of creation and making creation wheels. In History the children now finding out about Neil Armstrong & his journey to the moon.

Year 3/4

This Week we have been writing Non-Chronological reports comparing the Amazonian Rainforest with London. We have used facts from our planning and research stage of writing. Ask us about the Yanonami Tribe's houses and jobs compared to houses and jobs in London! In Maths, we have started learning about addition and subtraction, including formal written methods for addition. In Geography, we are learning about countries in the UK and their cities. ask us to locate on map! On Thursday evening, the Y3's at Kersall Drive were focused on enrichment, sleeping over in school. They enjoyed marshmallow toasting, a film and team activities before camping in tents.

Next Week...

In F1 we are going to go on a leaf hunt and look at signs of Autumn. In F2, we are going to look more closely at Robin Hood and Nottingham Castle. We are also going to remember everything we have learnt this half term! Next week in F1 and F2 we will also be celebrating Black History month by thinking about our rights and learning about significant figures such as Martin Luther King and Marcus Rashford who have stood up for people's rights.

> **Next Week...** is our final week of Transport. If you haven't completed any of our creative homework's given out at the start of the half term yet please do as we'd love to display them.

> KS1 at Kersall Drive will be going on their local walk to carry out transport surveys on the afternoon of Thursday 19th October 2023. If you would like to support us with this walk please speak to your child's class teacher.

> Our new topic overview and creative homework will be shared at the end of next week in homework books so you can see what we are going to be learning about after the holiday. Keep an eye out for it!

Year 5/6

This Week... Year 6 have got stuck into their four operations in maths, and SR found a missing numbers lesson particularly challenging! They must try to not fall for Miss Shaw's tricks. Y5 have spent more time consolidating their negative number knowledge. Both year groups have continued their work on 2d and 3d shapes as well including looking at angles. Kersall Drive have been writing character descriptions about their own alien characters whilst Scotland Road have been writing diary entries from the perspective of Lucky (the main character in Phoenix). It's been so great to see their confidence with vocabulary, figurative language and sentence structure. Oreos found their way into our science lesson to help us with understanding the phases of the moon.
