Position summary

GRI, the global leader in sustainability and impact reporting standards (www.globalreporting.org) is investing in North America (NA) to increase our voice and impact in the region. We are looking to add an experienced and passionate team member to help us manage the regional lifecycle for Standards development support and use - from recruiting NA representation for development groups, to securing stakeholder feedback during public comment periods, to launch and market adoption. You will be the catalyst for excellent Standards lifecycle management in the region, working closely with GRI Headquarters, the GRI NA team, and all appropriate stakeholders. The position's goal is to ensure that the GRI's global common language for impact reporting serves NA stakeholders and that the GRI Standards are understood and used as a pertinent tool to foster transparency and accountability to drive action to create a more sustainable and just world.

Responsibilities

- Day to day liaison between NA Advocacy and Standards project teams to coordinate GRI NA involvement with the GRI Global Sustainability Standards Board (GSSB) and Technical/ Working Group recruitment and regional public comment period (PCP) engagements.
- Perform research to identify regional GSSB, Technical/ Working Group, and PCP participant candidates and recruitment partners.
- Conduct outreach to candidates and recruitment partners for GSSB, Technical/ Working Group, and PCP participant candidates with NA Advocacy leadership.
- Research NA Topic Standards and Sector Standards development and roll out opportunities.
- Coordinate Sector Standard NA opportunity research with the Standards Division research to consolidate organizational intelligence to support NA Sector Standard development engagements and roll out.
- Develop and implement Sector Standards and Topic Standard roll out process for NA Advocacy leadership to create a coordinated, effective and consistent process with Standards Division.
- Project manage individual standards roll-out in support of NA Advocacy leadership.
- Support NA Advocacy leadership in external Advocacy engagements such as pursuing and lining-up external speaking and media engagements, performing prep and post event administrative tasks, and developing content.
- Liaise with NA Commercial Revenue leadership to identify opportunities to leverage Sector Standard Development and rollout endeavors to inform growth plans and increase commercial revenue.
